NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the 31st Annual General Meeting of the Company will be convened and held at Room 700, Stephen Riady Auditorium @NTUC, One Marina Boulevard, Singapore 018989 on Thursday, 24 April 2025 at 3:00 p.m. for the following purposes:

ORDINARY BUSINESS

1. To receive and adopt the Directors' statement and the audited financial statements for the financial year ended 31 December 2024 together with the auditors' report thereon. **(Resolution 1)**
2. To declare a first and final (one-tier, tax exempt) ordinary dividend of 3.72 Singapore cents per ordinary share for the year ended 31 December 2024. **(Resolution 2)**
3. To approve Directors' fees of S\$506,000 for the year ended 31 December 2024 (2023: S\$506,000). **(Resolution 3)**
4. To re-elect the following Directors, each of whom will retire by rotation pursuant to Regulation 94 of the Constitution of the Company and who, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election:

Mr Lin Yi	(Resolution 6)
5. To re-appoint BDO LLP as the Auditors of the Company and to authorise the Directors to fix their remuneration. **(Resolution 7)**

SPECIAL BUSINESS

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without modifications, the following resolutions as Ordinary Resolutions:

6. That pursuant to Section 161 of the Companies Act 1967 (the "**Companies Act**") and the listing rules of the Singapore Exchange Securities Trading Limited ("**SGX-ST**"), authority be and is hereby given to the Directors of the Company to:
 - (1) (a) issue shares in the capital of the Company ("**shares**") whether by way of rights, bonus or otherwise; and/or
 - (b) make or grant offers, agreements or options (collectively, "**Instruments**") that might or would require shares to be issued, including but not limited to the creation and issue of (as well as adjustments to) warrants, debentures or other instruments convertible into shares,

at any time and upon such terms and conditions and for such purposes and to such persons as the Directors may in their absolute discretion deem fit; and
- (2) (notwithstanding that the authority conferred by this Resolution may have ceased to be in force) issue shares in pursuance to any Instrument made or granted by the Directors while this Resolution was in force,

Provided that:

- (1) the aggregate number of shares to be issued pursuant to this Resolution (including shares to be issued in pursuance of Instruments made or granted pursuant to this Resolution) does not exceed 50% of the issued shares (excluding treasury shares and subsidiary holdings) in the capital of the Company (as calculated in accordance with sub-paragraph (2) below), of which the aggregate number of shares to be issued other than on a pro-rata basis to shareholders of the Company (including shares to be issued in pursuance of Instruments made or granted pursuant to this Resolution) does not exceed 15% of the issued shares (excluding treasury shares and subsidiary holdings) in the capital of the Company (as calculated in accordance with sub-paragraph (2) below);
- (2) (subject to such manner of calculation as may be prescribed by the SGX-ST) for the purpose of determining the aggregate number of shares that may be issued under sub-paragraph (1) above, the percentage of issued share capital shall be based on the issued shares (excluding treasury shares and subsidiary holdings) in the capital of the Company at the time of the passing of this Resolution, after adjusting for:
 - (a) new shares arising from the conversion or exercise of any convertible securities or share options or vesting of share awards which are outstanding at the time of the passing of this Resolution; and
 - (b) any subsequent consolidation or subdivision of shares;

and, in sub-paragraph (1) above and this sub-paragraph (2), “subsidiary holdings” has the meaning given to it in the Listing Manual of the SGX-ST;

- (3) in exercising the authority conferred by this Resolution, the Company shall comply with the provisions of the Listing Manual of the SGX-ST for the time being in force (unless such compliance has been waived by the SGX-ST) and the Constitution for the time being of the Company; and
- (4) (unless revoked or varied by the Company in general meeting) the authority conferred by this Resolution shall continue in force until the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting of the Company or the date by which the next Annual General Meeting of the Company is required by law to be held, whichever is the earlier. **(Resolution 8)**

7. That:

- (1) approval be and is hereby given for the renewal of the shareholders’ general mandate (which was last renewed at the annual general meeting of the Company held on 25 April 2024) for the Company, its subsidiaries and associated companies which fall within the definition of entities at risk under Chapter 9 of the Listing Manual of the SGX-ST or any of them to enter into any of the transactions falling within the categories of interested person transactions set out in Annex II to the Company’s Letter to Shareholders dated 1 April 2025 (the “**Letter**”), with any party who is of the class or classes of interested persons described in Annex II to the Letter, provided that such transactions are made on normal commercial terms and are not prejudicial to the Company and its minority shareholders, and are entered into in accordance with the review procedures for interested person transactions as set out in Annex II to the Letter (the “**IPT Mandate**”);
- (2) the IPT Mandate shall, unless revoked or varied by the Company in a general meeting, continue in force until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or until the date on which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by law to be held, whichever is the earlier;

- (3) the Audit Committee of the Company (comprising Independent Directors, Mr Teo Ser Luck, Mr Hee Theng Fong and Dr Fu Xingran, and Non-Independent, Non-Executive Directors, Mr Zhang Yuchen and Dr Richard Yang Minghui, as at the date of the Letter) be and is hereby authorised to take such action as it deems proper in respect of the procedures and/or to modify or implement such procedures as may be necessary to take into consideration any amendment to Chapter 9 of the Listing Manual which may be prescribed by the SGX-ST from time to time; and
- (4) the Directors and each of them be and are hereby authorised and empowered to complete and to do all such other acts and things as they may consider necessary, desirable or expedient in the interests of the Company in connection with or for the purposes of giving full effect to the IPT Mandate. **(Resolution 9)**

8. That:

- (1) for the purposes of the Companies Act, the exercise by the Directors of all the powers of the Company to purchase or otherwise acquire fully paid issued ordinary shares in the capital of the Company (the “**Shares**”) not exceeding in aggregate the Maximum Limit (as hereafter defined), at such price or prices as may be determined by the Directors from time to time up to the Maximum Price (as hereafter defined), whether by way of:
 - (a) on-market purchase(s) on the SGX-ST and/or any other stock exchange on which the Shares may for the time being be listed and quoted (the “**Other Exchange**”); and/or
 - (b) off-market purchase(s) if effected otherwise than on the SGX-ST or, as the case may be, the Other Exchange in accordance with any equal access scheme(s) as may be determined or formulated by the Directors as they consider fit, which scheme(s) shall satisfy all the conditions prescribed by the Companies Act;and otherwise in accordance with all other laws, regulations and rules of the SGX-ST or, as the case may be, the Other Exchange as may for the time being be applicable, be and is hereby authorised and approved generally and unconditionally (the “**Share Purchase Mandate**”);
- (2) unless varied or revoked by the Company in a general meeting, the authority conferred on the Directors pursuant to the Share Purchase Mandate may be exercised by the Directors at any time and from time to time during the period commencing from the date of the passing of this Resolution and expiring on the earlier of:
 - (a) the date on which the next annual general meeting of the Company is held;
 - (b) the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by law to be held; and
 - (c) the date on which purchases or acquisitions of ordinary shares of the Company pursuant to the Share Purchase Mandate are carried out to the full extent mandated; and
- (3) the Directors and each of them be and are hereby authorised and empowered to complete and to do all such other acts and things as they may consider necessary, desirable or expedient in the interests of the Company in connection with or for the purposes of giving full effect to the Share Purchase Mandate.

For the purposes of this Resolution:

“**Average Closing Price**” means the average of the closing market prices of the shares over the last five (5) market days, on which transactions in the shares on the SGX-ST were recorded, before the day on which a market purchase was made by the Company or, as the case may be, the date of the announcement of the offer pursuant to an off-market purchase, and only in the case of a market purchase, deemed to be adjusted in accordance with the listing rules of the SGX-ST for any corporate action which occurs after the relevant period of five (5) market days and the day on which the market purchase was made;

“Maximum Limit” means that number of issued shares representing ten per cent. (10%) of the total number of shares of the Company (excluding treasury shares and subsidiary holdings) as at the last annual general meeting or as at the date of the passing of this Resolution (whichever is the higher); and

“Maximum Price”, in relation to a share to be purchased or acquired, means the purchase price (excluding brokerage, stamp duties, commission, applicable goods and services tax and other related expenses) which shall not exceed:

- (a) in the case of an on-market purchase of a share, one hundred and five per cent. (105%) of the Average Closing Price of the shares; and
- (b) in the case of an off-market purchase of a share pursuant to an equal access scheme, one hundred and ten per cent. (110%) of the Average Closing Price of the Shares.

9. To transact any other ordinary business which may properly be transacted at an annual general meeting.

Notes:

1. The members of the Company are invited to **attend physically** at the 31st Annual General Meeting (“AGM”). There will be no option for shareholders to participate virtually. This Notice of 31st AGM (“Notice”) will be sent to members by electronic means via publication on the Company’s website at the URL <https://www.caosco.com/shareholders-meetings> under “Investors-Shareholders’ Meetings” and is also made available on SGXNet at the URL <https://www.sgx.com/securities/company-announcements>. For convenience, printed copies of this Notice will also be sent by post to members.
2. Members (including Central Provident Fund Investment Scheme investors (“CPFIS Investors”) and/or Supplementary Retirement Scheme investors (“SRS Investors”)) may participate in the AGM by: (a) attending the AGM in person; (b) raising questions at the AGM or submitting questions in advance of the AGM; and/or (c) voting at the AGM (i) themselves personally; or (ii) through their duly appointed proxy(ies). CPFIS Investors and SRS Investors who wish to appoint the Chairman of the AGM (and not third-party proxy(ies)) as proxy should approach their respective CPF Agent Banks or SRS Operators to submit their votes by 5.00 p.m. on 14 April 2025, being seven (7) working days prior to the date of the AGM. Please bring along your NRIC/passport so as to enable the Company to verify your identity. Members are requested to arrive early to facilitate the registration process and are advised not to attend the AGM if they are feeling unwell. Members are strongly encouraged to exercise social responsibility to rest at home and consider appointing a proxy or proxies to attend the Meeting. We encourage members to mask up when attending the AGM.
3. A member who is not a Relevant Intermediary is entitled to appoint not more than two (2) proxies to attend, speak and vote on his/her/its behalf at the AGM. A member of the Company which is a corporation is entitled to appoint its authorised representative or proxy to vote on its behalf. A proxy need not be a member of the Company. Where such member appoints two (2) proxies, the proportion of his or her shareholding to be represented by each proxy shall be specified. If no proportion is specified, the Company shall be entitled to treat the first named proxy as representing the entire number of shares entered against his or her name in the Depository Register and any second named proxy as an alternate to the first named.
4. A member who is a Relevant Intermediary is entitled to appoint more than two (2) proxies to attend, speak and vote at the AGM, but each proxy must be appointed to exercise the rights attached to a different share or shares held by such member. Where such member appoints more than two (2) proxies, the number and class of shares in relation to which each proxy has been appointed shall be specified in the form of proxy. “Relevant Intermediary” has the meaning ascribed to it in Section 181 of the Companies Act, 1967: (a) a banking corporation licensed under the Banking Act 1970, or a wholly owned subsidiary of such a banking corporation, whose business includes the provision of nominee services and who holds shares in that capacity; (b) a person holding a capital market services licence to provide custodial services for securities under the Securities and Futures Act 2001 and who holds shares in that capacity; or (c) the Central Provident Fund Board established by the Central Provident Fund Act 1953, in respect of shares purchased under the subsidiary legislation made under that Act providing for the making of investments from the contributions and interest standing to the credit of members of the Central Provident Fund, if the Board holds those shares in the capacity of an intermediary pursuant to or in accordance with the subsidiary legislation.

5. A member can appoint the Chairman of the Meeting as his/her/its proxy but this is not mandatory. If a member wishes to appoint the Chairman of the Meeting as proxy, such member (whether individual or corporate) must give specific instructions as to voting for, voting against, or abstentions from voting on, each resolution in the instrument appointing the Chairman of the Meeting as proxy. If no specific direction is given as to voting or abstention from voting in respect of a resolution in the form of proxy, the Chairman of the AGM as proxy will vote or abstain from voting at his/her discretion, as he/she will on any other matter arising at the AGM.
6. The instrument appointing a proxy(ies) must be submitted to the Company in the following manner:

In each case, by **3:00 p.m. on 21 April 2025**, being not less than 72 hours before the time appointed for holding the AGM. In the case of members of the Company whose shares are entered against their names in the Depository Register, the Company may reject any instrument appointing a proxy lodged if such members are not shown to have shares in the Company entered against their names in the Depository Register as at 72 hours before the time appointed for holding the AGM as certified by The Central Depository (Pte) Limited to the Company.

7. 8. For questions addressed during the AGM, the responses to such questions will be included in the minutes of the AGM which will be published on the Company's corporate website and on SGXNet within one (1) month after the AGM.

| Resolution 8 | Ordinary Resolution 8 is to authorise the Directors, from the date of the above Annual General Meeting until the next Annual General Meeting, to issue shares in the Company. The aggregate number of shares which the Directors may issue under this Resolution shall not exceed fifty per cent. (50%) of the issued shares (excluding treasury shares and subsidiary holdings) in the capital of the Company, of which the aggregate number of shares to be issued other than on a pro-rata basis to existing shareholders shall not exceed fifteen per cent. (15%) of the issued shares (excluding treasury shares and subsidiary holdings) in the capital of the Company. The percentage of issued share capital is based on the Company's issued shares (excluding treasury shares and subsidiary holdings) in the capital of the Company at the time this proposed Ordinary Resolution is passed, after adjusting for (a) new shares arising from the conversion of convertible securities or share options on issue at the time this proposed Ordinary Resolution is passed; and (b) any subsequent consolidation or subdivision of shares. |
| Resolution 9 | Ordinary Resolution 9 is to approve the renewal of the mandate to permit the Company, its subsidiaries and associated companies that are entities at risk (as that term is used in Chapter 9 of the Listing Manual of the SGX-ST), or any of them, to enter into certain types of interested person transactions with certain classes of interested persons as described in the Letter. |

Resolution 10 Ordinary Resolution 10 is to renew the mandate to permit the Company to purchase or acquire issued ordinary shares in the capital of the Company on the terms and subject to the conditions of the Resolution.

The Company may use internal sources of funds, or a combination of internal resources and external borrowings, to finance the purchase or acquisition of its ordinary shares. The amount of funding required for the Company to purchase or acquire its ordinary shares and the impact on the Company's financial position cannot be ascertained as at the date of this Notice of Annual General Meeting as these will depend on the number of ordinary shares purchased or acquired and the price at which such ordinary shares were purchased or acquired and whether the ordinary shares purchased or acquired are held in treasury or cancelled. The Company will not rely on external borrowings to finance purchases or acquisitions of its ordinary shares to such extent that it would materially affect the financial position, working capital requirements or investment ability of the CAO Group.

Regulation 94 of the Constitution of the Company

Every Director shall retire from office at least once every three (3) years and for this purpose, at each annual general meeting, one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three (3), the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire from office by rotation.

Notice of Record Date and Payment Date for First and Final Dividend (One-Tier, Tax Exempt) ("Ordinary Dividend")

The Company gives notice that, subject to the approval of the shareholders being obtained for the Ordinary Dividend at the 31st Annual General Meeting of the Company to be held on 24 April 2025, the Record Date to determine entitlements to the Ordinary Dividend is 13 May 2025 (the "**Record Date**"). Registrable transfers received by the Company's Registrar, Boardroom Corporate & Advisory Services Pte Ltd at 1 Harbourfront Avenue, #14-07 Keppel Bay Tower, Singapore 098632 up to 5:00 p.m. on the Record Date, will be registered for the Ordinary Dividend. Holders of ordinary shares of the Company as at the Record Date will be entitled to receive the Ordinary Dividend. In respect of ordinary shares in securities accounts with The Central Depository (Pte) Limited ("**CDP**"), the Ordinary Dividend will be paid by the Company to CDP which will, in turn, distribute the entitlements to the Ordinary Dividend to CDP account holders in accordance with its normal practice.

The Ordinary Dividend, if approved by shareholders, will be paid on 27 May 2025.
